Thank you for your response of January 14 and your statement of the emphasis in 1888.


I presume I have access to all that you refer to and I believe to a good many things that you do not have, together with the statements of men who were personally present, like W. W. Prescott, A. O. Tait, and others. There were only five, I believe it was, or possibly six, of the series that dealt particularly upon the book of Galatians and this was a feature that had to be dealt with just as the Arian concept of a derived Christ before he could come to his real theme.

It will be profitless, I presume, for me to say anything further concerning this. You have come to your own conclusions and I have learned that when you do so, that is the end of it for you.

I somehow wish we could work together, share together some of these things. But you ^{don't} have access to what I have assembled through the years.

The strong leadership backing for this material has led us to very materially strengthen and add certain features that will make it of greater world wide significance. This great theme has thrilled my soul. Its vast breadth, and great sweep, are most impressive. God help us to take in the full picture.
