Your letter of March 23, 1971 has been here for many months. Your recent publication, Movement of Destiny, has settled forever that the 1888 General Conference Session was indeed a crisis session and must be recognized in denominational history as having great significance for the entire church to the end of time.

In your work you have indicated that a public confession should be made and I must concur with you that we are prepared to make such a confession, in fact we believe we should. Before this is presented to the church we would like to get from you the answer to a very perplexing problem.

Before your book was published you indicated to us that you would present certain Spirit of Prophecy statements of which we knew nothing. We looked forward with great anticipation to seeing these statements. I have now carefully searched your book to find these, but they are not there.

As we have continued to study this very important era of our history which you have called the entire church to note, the question presents itself: Why is it that you did not present the clear and unequivocal testimony of the Lord which is in the vault of the Ellen G White Publications and which is diametrically opposed to your presentation regarding the rejection of the beginning of the Latter Rain and the Loud Cry as given to us in 1888?

I would repeat Dr Froom, I believe we must make ^a confession which your book so clearly demands. Before this is done it seemed the part of wisdom to get your answer on this above very pertinent question.
